

# Commercial/Healthcare Exchange PA Criteria

Effective: November 13, 2019

**Prior Authorization:** Nayzilam

**Products Affected:** Nayzilam (midazolam) nasal spray

<u>Medication Description</u>: NAYZILAM (midazolam) nasal spray is a nasally administered benzodiazepine indicated for the acute treatment of intermittent, stereotypic episodes of frequent seizure activity (i.e., seizure clusters, acute repetitive seizures) that are distinct from a patient's usual seizure pattern in patients with epilepsy 12 years of age and older. The exact mechanism of action for midazolam is not fully understood, but it is thought to involve potentiation of the GABAergic neurotransmission resulting from the binding at the benzodiazepine site of the GABA<sub>A</sub> receptor.

<u>Covered Uses</u>: the acute treatment of intermittent, stereotypic episodes of frequent seizure activity (i.e., seizure clusters, acute repetitive seizures) that are distinct from a patient's usual seizure pattern in patients with epilepsy 12 years of age and older.

### Exclusion Criteria:

- 1. Patients with known hypersensitivity to midazolam.
- 2. Acute narrow-angle glaucoma

### **Required Medical Information:**

1. Diagnosis

**Age Restrictions:** 12 years of age or older

**Prescriber Restrictions:** Prescribed by, or in consultation with, a neurologist.

**Coverage Duration:** 12 months

#### Other Criteria:

- A. Patient has a diagnosis of epilepsy; AND
- B. Patient will be using Nayzilam for the acute treatment of intermittent episodes of frequent seizure activity (i.e., seizure clusters, acute repetitive seizures) are distinct from usual seizure pattern with epilepsy; AND
- C. Patient is currently receiving maintenance antiepileptic medication(s) (e.g., lamotrigine, gabapentin, topiramate, oxcarbazepine).
