



Drug (s)	Xadago (safinamide)

Indications	Xadago is a monoamine oxidase type B (MAO-B) inhibitor indicated as adjunctive treatment to levodopa/carbidopa in patients with Parkinson's disease (PD) experiencing "off" episodes.
CRITERIA	 Patient has clinically diagnosed with Parkinson's Disease Medication is being prescribed by, or in consultation with, a neurologist Patient is currently using a levodopa-carbidopa combination Patient must have had previous therapy with, contraindication, or intolerance to selegiline AND rasagiline Patient is NOT currently using any of the following medications: Other monoamine oxidase inhibitors or drugs that are potent inhibitors of monoamine oxidase (e.g., linezolid) Opioid drugs (e.g. tramadol, meperidine and related derivatives) Selective norepinephrine reuptake inhibitors (SNRIs) Tri-or tetra-cyclic or triazolopyridine antidepressants (trazodone) Cyclobenzaprine Methylphenidate, amphetamine, and their derivatives Dextromethorphan
LIMITATIONS	Xadago has not been shown to be effective as monotherapy for Parkinson's Disease. Xadago is contraindicated in patients with severe hepatic impairment (Child-Pugh C: 10-15)
